

Statement of Deficiencies

1901-K.&L.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

Not Met

1901-K.&L.: Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901-K.&L.: Items that Can be harmful to Children: Based on observation: Items that can be harmful to children, such as equipment, tools and other potentially dangerous utensils, were not kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. On 1/10/17 during the inspection; Specialist observed that it was a large orange and silver latter sitting on the bleachers of the gymnasium during play time. S1 states that the center lacks storage that can accommodate the latter's size. Specialist informed S1 that the latter was a tipping hazard and should not be accessible to the children.

1901-N: Strings and Cords

Not Met

1901-N: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

Finding:

1901-N Based on observations: Strings and cords were accessible to children under age 4 as on 1/10/17 during inspection the Specialist observed that that a silver and blue radio which was plugged into a low power socket and sitting on a shelf had a cord that was exposed and accessible to the children. When Specialist informed S8 and S1 of the hazard it was immediately removed.

1901-Q: Staff Personal Belongings

Not Met

1901-Q: The personal belongings of center staff members shall be inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901-Q Based on observations: During the inspection on 1/10/17 there were personal belongings on the floor of S8's room; pink and white striped bag and black coat; the items were accessible to the children. Specialist informed S1 that staff personal belongings need to be out of the reach of children.
