

Statement of Deficiencies

713.A: Office of Public Health, State Fire, City Fire, Office of Early Childhood approval

Not Met

713.A: Current approvals by the Office of Public Health, Office of State Fire Marshal, City Fire (if applicable), Office of Early Childhood and the Licensing Division shall be required before the expiration of an existing license.

Finding:

713.A Based on record review: The center failed to have current approvals from Office of Public Health the last approval was 12/29/16.

1503-A-C: General Liability Insurance Policy

Not Met

1503-A-C: A. A center shall maintain in force at all times current commercial liability insurance for the operation of the center to ensure medical coverage for children in the event of accident or injury.

B. A center is responsible for payment of medical expenses of a child injured while in the center's care.

C. Documentation of commercial liability insurance shall consist of the insurance policy or current binder that includes the name of the early learning center, physical address of the center, name of the insurance company, policy number, period of coverage and explanation of the coverage.

Finding:

1503-A-C Based on record review: The center lacked required documentation of current commercial liability insurance for the operation of the center to ensure medical coverage for children in the event of accident or injury. S1 stated the last certificate of insurance that she was given was effective 3/4/16 and the expiration date was 3/4/17.

1507-A: Daily Attendance Records - Children

Not Met

1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507-A Based on record review: The Provider lacked documentation of a daily attendance record for children that included the time of arrival and departure of each child and the first and last name of the person to whom the child was released

1507-B: Daily Attendance Records - Staff and Owners

Not Met

1507-B: A daily attendance record for all staff members and owners shall be maintained that shall:

1. include the first and last name of the staff member or owner and arrival and departure times;
2. accurately reflect the staff members and owners on the center premises at any given time; and
3. be used to document staff members and owners who leave and return to the center during the day

Finding:

1507-B Based on record review: The center did not maintain documentation of a daily attendance record for Staff and Owners, to include the time of arrival and departure. The last date specialist observed staff signed in was 11/27/17.

1721-A. - C.: Continuing Education Training

Not Met

1721-A. - C.: Early learning centers shall provide opportunities for continuing education of staff members. The center staff of Type III centers, excluding Foster Grandparents, shall obtain a minimum of 12 clock hours of training annually in the topics found in §1719(A) and (B) conducted by trainers approved by the Licensing Division. The Licensing Division shall keep a registry of approved trainers.

B. These Hours are in addition to the 3 hours required for health and safety.

C. Copies of certificates of completion or attendance records shall be maintained at the center and available for inspection by the Licensing Division upon request.

Finding:

1721-A. - C. Based on record review: There was no documentation that the center staff of Type III centers, obtained a minimum of 12 clock hours of training annually in the topics found in §1719(A) and (B) conducted by trainers approved by the Licensing Division, This is in addition to the required training from the Department of Health, Pediatric First Aid and Infant/Child/Adult CPR.
