Statement of Deficiencies

1721.A.-C.: Continuing Education Training

1721.A.-C.: A. Early learning centers shall provide opportunities for continuing education of staff members who are left alone with children, or who have supervisory or disciplinary authority over children.

1. Staff members of early learning centers, excluding foster grandparents, shall obtain a minimum of 12 clock hours of continuing education per center anniversary year.

B. Staff members of type I, type II and type III centers who are neither left alone with children, nor have supervisory or disciplinary authority over children, shall obtain a minimum of three clock hours of continuing education in job related topics per center's anniversary year.

C. Continuing education for all types of centers shall be conducted by trainers approved by the department. The department shall keep a registry of approved trainers.

Finding:

1721.A.-C. Based on record review at approximately 11:37am, S1 failed to have documentation that the center staff of an early learning center, excluding Foster Grandparents, provided opportunities for staff members to obtain a minimum of 12 clock hours of training annually in the topics found in §1719(A) and (B). Copies of certificates of completion or attendance records were not maintained at the center and available for inspection by the department upon request, zero of five staff did not have the required continuing education training. This is in addition to the required training from the Department of Health, Pediatric First Aid and Infant/Child/Adult CPR.

Corrective Action Plan: S1 contacted a trainer with Agenda for Children and stated that staff are scheduled for a six hour training course on 1/13/20. S1 stated that she will enroll staff for additional training hours as courses become available.

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A.&B. Based on record review at approximately 11:28am, S1 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department. Zero of five staff had documentation of this certification.

Corrective Action Plan: S1 attempted to contact her trainer to schedule a training course. S1 stated that she was sent a message from the trainer asking to contact her between 4:30pm and 5:00pm to schedule a date for the course.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.C. Based on record review at approximately 11:28am, S1 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department. Zero of five staff had documentation of this certification.

Corrective Action Plan: S1 attempted to contact her trainer to schedule a training course. S1 stated that she was sent a message from the trainer asking to contact her between 4:30pm and 5:00pm to schedule a date for the course.

1725.A.-C.: Medication Management Training

1725.A.-C.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.

B. Whether the center is administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration and at least one on the premises. A staff member who is a licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved child care health consultant.

Finding:

1725.A.-C. Based on record review: S1 submitted 3 out 4 altered certificated for medication administration training for staff, S1, S2, S3 and S5 for review during the licensing inspection. Specialist observed the "8" in the completion year date of 2018 on certificates for S1, S3 and S5 written over the

Corrective Action Plan: S1 stated that if a trainer has made a mistake on the documentation, she will make sure the trainer puts a line through the mistake and initial it.
