

Statement of Deficiencies

1725.A.-C.: Medication Management Training

Not Met

1725.A.-C.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.

B. Whether the center is administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration and at least one on the premises. A staff member who is a licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved child care health consultant.

Finding:

1725.A.-C.: Medication Management Training: Based on record review: At 11:30am, Specialist completed a review of medication authorization forms for C1 (age 3), C2 (age 2), C3 (age 3), C4 (age 1), C5 (age 1), and C6 (age 3) and observed S1 and S13 administered medication without a current training in medication management with an approved Child Care Health Consultant. C1 was administered medication 91 times from 7/13/2020-1/12/2021; C2 was administered medication two times on 12/29/2020; C3 was administered seven times from 12/15/2020-12/18/2020; C4 was administered one time on 8/14/2020; C5 was administered one time on 8/10/2020; and C6 was administered seven times in July 2020, and three times in December 2020. Training is required every two years and S1 and S13's training expired in May 2020.

Corrective Action Plan: Effective 1/13/2021, S1 stated she, S2, and S13 will complete the medication administration training with a Child Care Health Consultant via Zoom meeting on 1/14/2021 at 6:00pm. S1 will complete the training at minimum every two years to ensure this deficiency is not recited.
