

## Statement of Deficiencies

### 1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

Not Met

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

#### Finding:

1723.A.&B.: Based on Specialist's review of records at 1:30pm, S1 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in adult, infant, and child CPR through training approved by the department. 3 of 9 staff present had documentation of this certification. S1 stated that several staff who were CPR certified are no longer employed at the center, and that on a typical day there usually 5-6 staff present instead of 9. Corrective Action Plan: S1 stated that she will schedule a CPR training for more staff to become certified ASAP.

### 1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

#### Finding:

1723.C. Based on Specialist's review of records at 1:30pm, S1 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department. 3 of 9 staff present had documentation of this certification. S1 stated that several staff who were PFA certified are no longer employed at the center, and that on a typical day there usually 5-6 staff present instead of 9. Corrective Action Plan: S1 stated that she will schedule a PFA training for more staff to become certified ASAP.
