

Statement of Deficiencies

1725.A.-C.: Medication Management Training

Not Met

1725.A.-C.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.

B. Whether the center is administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration and at least one on the premises. A staff member who is a licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved child care health consultant.

Finding:

1725.A.-C. Based on record review/interview(s) at 10:45am, S1 failed to have at least two staff members trained in medication administration whether the early learning center administers medication or not. S1 called and sent emails to schedule the class during the inspection but failed to get a response prior to specialist departure.

Corrective Action Plan: S1 will review to ensure the classes are taken prior to expiration to ensure that there is no lapse and adequate staff have training in the future.

1901.M.: Strings and Cords

Not Met

1901.M.: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

Finding:

1901.M. Based on observations at 10:15am, Cords were accessible to children under age 4 as evidenced by a power surge was lying on the floor under the table in S2's classroom. S2 stated that it did not work and placed it in the trashcan.

Corrective Action Plan; S1 stated she will walk around the building daily to ensure all strings and cords are inaccessible to the children.
