

Statement of Deficiencies

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

Not Met

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A. Based on record review at approximately 11:00 a.m., S1 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department. 8 of 8 staff on premises had documentation of a 1-year provisional CPR Certification for an online portion completed on 6/11/2021. During the licensing visit, S1 contacted the center's Health and Nutrition Coordinator to schedule the in-person skills portion and is awaiting a response.

Corrective Action Plan: Effective 1/19/2022, S1 stated she will schedule the in-person skills portion within 7 days of completing the online portion to ensure the center's staff receives the correct certification.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.C. Based on record review at approximately 11:00 a.m., S1 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department as 8 of 8 staff on premises had documentation of a 1-year provisional Pediatric First Aid certification for an online portion completed on 6/11/2021. During the licensing visit, S1 contacted the center's Health and Nutrition Coordinator to schedule the in-person skills portion and is awaiting a response.

Corrective Action Plan: Effective 1/19/2022, S1 stated she will schedule the in-person skills portion within 7 days of completing the online portion to ensure the center's staff receives the correct certification.
