Finding:

1503-D Based on record review: Parents are required to waive the provider's responsibility in the event of an accident or injury as documented on CPSB Student Accident Insurance Form that states, "If a Calcasieu Parish School Board student is accidentally injured at school or participating in a school sponsored event, the cost for any medical treatment is the responsibility of the parent/guardian." Per S1, this form is verbally reviewed with all parents during orientation. No signed copies are retained in the students files and the information is not included in the Parent Handbook. Per S1, the center does not offer medical insurance coverage to enrolled children of the center in the event of an accident on the child care premises.

Finding:

1915-B. Based on interviews/record review: The S2 and S3 did not have documentation of any incidents or unusual behaviors regarding C1, despite stating that C1 typically has a behavioral incident on a daily basis, sometimes multiple times a day. S2 stated that he typically only writes behavior reports when a students behavior harms another student.
