1917.K.: Emergency Medication Plan and Records

Based on record review conducted on 1/29/2020 at 12:20 PM, S2 failed to have an emergency medication plan of action for C11, to include the symptoms that indicate the need for the Epi Pen, actions to take once the symptoms occur and a description of how to use the Epi Pen. S2 also failed to have an emergency medication plan of action for C7, to include the symptoms that indicate the need for the Epi Pen and a description of how to use the medication.

CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN: S2 will have the parents of C7 and C11 complete the correct Emergency Medication form by 1/30/2020.

1919.J.: Bottled Formula/Breast Milk Properly Labeled

1919.J.: Bottled formula/breast milk for infants shall be labeled with the child's name.

Finding:

1919.J. Bottled Formula/Breast Milk Properly Labeled. Based on observations, on 1/29/2020 at 9:45 AM, S6 did not have 3 bottles of formula for C1 labeled with his name. S6 corrected the issue prior to Specialist exiting the center.

CORRECTION ACTION PLAN: S2 will meet with infant staff on 1/30/2020 to ensure that all bottles are labeled prior to being placed in the refrigerator. If the parent has not labeled the bottle with the child's name, then the staff member will label the bottle with the child's name.
