

## Statement of Deficiencies

### 1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

Not Met

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

#### Finding:

1723.A.&B.: Based on Specialist's review of records/interview on 2/11/2020, at 10:15am, S1 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant, child, and adult CPR through training approved by the Department. 0 of 5 staff present had documentation of this certification. The certification for all five staff expired on 1/31/2020. S1 stated that she was unaware that the expiration date had passed.

Corrective Action Plan: On 2/11/2020, S1 stated that she would schedule a CPR training class ASAP for center staff to renew their certifications.

### 1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

#### Finding:

1723.C. Based on Specialist's review of records/interview on 2/11/2020, at 10:15am, S1 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the Department. 0 of 5 staff present had documentation of this certification. The certification for all five staff expired on 1/31/2020. S1 stated that she was unaware that the expiration date had passed.

Corrective Action Plan: On 2/11/2020, S1 stated that she would schedule a PFA training class ASAP for center staff to renew their certifications.
