1509-A.4: Disclosure of Information Policy that provides notice to parents of the licensing authority of the Licensing Division and the availability of licensing surveys/inspections, regulations and information regarding early learning centers from the Department of Education website.

Finding

1509-A.4: Disclosure of Information Policy. Based on interview and record review. The Provider did not have a Policy/Procedure to provide notice to parents of the licensing authority of the Licensing Division and the availability of licensing surveys/inspections, regulations and information regarding early learning centers from the Department of Education's website.

1509-A.5: Complaint Policy

1509-A.5: Complaint Policy

Parents shall be advised of the licensing authority of the Licensing Division along with the current telephone number and email address. Parents shall also be advised that they may call or write the Licensing Division should they have significant, unresolved licensing complaints.

Provider did not have a policy/procedure to advise Parents of the licensing authority of the Licensing Division along with the current telephone number and email address. Parents shall also be advised that they may call or write the Licensing Division should they have significant, unresolved licensing complaints.

1509-A.9: Electronic Devices Policy

1509-A.9: Electronic Devices Policy that provides that all activities involving electronic devices, including but not limited to television, movies, games, videos, computers and hand held electronic devices, shall adhere to the following limitations:

Provider did not have a written Electronic Devices Policy that provides that all activities involving electronic devices, including but not limited to television, movies, games, videos, computers and hand held electronic devices, are prohibited for children under are two and time allowed for electronic device activities for children ages two and above shall not exceed 2 hours per day.

1509-A.11: Programs, Movies and Video Games Policy

- a. Programs, movies, and video games with violent or adult content, including but not limited to soap operas, television news, and sports programs aimed at audiences other than children, shall not be permitted in the presence of children.

1509-A.11: Programs, Movies and Video games Policy. based on record review, The Provider did not have a Programs, Movies and Video Games Policy requiring: Programs, movies, and video games with violent or adult content, including but not limited to soap operas, television news, and sports programs aimed at audiences other than children, shall not be permitted in the presence of children. All television, video, DVD, or other programming

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shall be suitable for the youngest child present. PG programming or its television equivalent shall not be shown to children under age 5. PG programming shall only be viewed by children age 5 and above and shall require written parental authorization. Any programming with a rating more restrictive than PG is prohibited. All video games shall be suitable for the youngest child with access to the games. E10+ rated games shall be permitted for children ages 10 years and older. T and M rated games are prohibited.

1725-A.-E.: Medication Management Training

1725-A.-E.:

- A. Begining July 1, 2016 All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.
- B. Whether administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration.
- C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved Child Care Health Consultant.
- D. A licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

Finding:

1725-A.E: medication Training. Based on interview with S1 and record review, After July 1, 2016, the provider did not have at least two staff members trained in medication administration whether the early learning center administers medication or not. S1 has medication training but no one else. Provider stated that she was not aware they had to have two people as they do ot give medicine.

1907-C.2: Sleeping Arrangements Labeled

Not Met

1907-C.2: Individual sleeping accommodations shall be assigned to a child on a permanent basis and labeled, unless the cots or mats are sanitized daily.

Finding:

1907-C.2: Sleeping arrangements. Based on observation, Each child's sleeping accommodations were not assigned to him/her on a permanent basis as they were not labeled. Several cots in each classroom were not numbered or labeled.

1907-D.1: Bed Coverings Not Met

1907-D.1: A labeled sheet for covering the cot or mat and a labeled sheet or blanket for covering the child shall be provided by either the center or the parent, unless the cots or mats are covered with vinyl or another washable surface.

Finding:

1907-D.1: Bed Coverings. Based on observation, The staff or the parent did not provide a labeled sheet or blanket for covering the child. Several blankets in each room were not numbered or labeled.

1907-E.2: Cribs Free of Toys and Other Soft or Loose Bedding

Not Met

1907-E.2: Cribs shall be free of toys and other soft or loose bedding, including comforters, blankets, sheets, bumper pads, pillows, stuffed animals and wedges when the child is in the crib.

Finding:

1907-E.2: Cribs free of Toys and Other soft or loose bedding. Based on observation, The center's cribs were not free of loose bedding (including comforters, blankets, sheets, bumper pads, pillows, stuffed animals and wedges) while the child was in the crib as evidence by three infants in their cribs with a loose blanket. Specialist arrived at 9:45 and observed the three children in the cribs with loose blankets and advised the teachers in that room and the staff on charge that they could not have the looses blankets. When specialist returned to check the room at 11:15, there were two different children with loose blankets on their crib.

1909-D: Infants - Car Seats Not Met

1909-D: Written authorization from a physician is required for a child to sleep in a car seat or other similar device and shall include the amount of time that the child is allowed to remain in said device.

Finding:

1909-D: Infants-Car Seats. Based on observation, Written authorization from a physician was not available for 2 of 8 infants as required for infant to sleep in a car seat or other similar device. The authorization did not include the amount of time that the child is allowed to remain in said device. Specialist observed two infants asleep in bouncer chairs.

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1915-A: Health Services - Observation

Not Met

1915-A: Upon arrival at the center, the physical condition of each child shall be observed for possible signs of illness, infections, bruises or injuries, and when something is observed, it shall be documented and such documentation shall include an explanation from the parent or child.

Finding

T1915-A: Health Services-Observation. Based on record review and interview, the staff did not document observations, when something is observed, noted on children upon arrival to the center. The infant classroom had no observations since, 2/1/17. The one year old classroom had no observations since 1/4/17. The two year old class did not have any observations since 8/11/16. Some observations were also missing explanations.
