Statement of Deficiencies

1507.A.: Daily Attendance Records - Children

Not Met

1507.A.: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time, and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507.A. Based on observations/record review: The center's daily attendance record for children did not accurately reflect the children on the child care premises at any given time as on 2/18/19, 28 children were present and 27 children were signed in on the log. Building #1 had 12 children present and 10 children signed in on the log; building #2 had 16 children present and 17 children signed in on the log.

1713.E.&F.: Supervision Participation

Not Met

1713.E.&F.:

E: While supervising a group of children, staff shall devote their time to supervising the children, meeting the needs of the children, and participating with them in their activities.

F: Staff duties that include cooking, housekeeping or administrative functions shall not interfere with the supervision of children.

Finding:

1713.E Based on observations: On 2/18/19, while supervising a group of children, childcare staff did not devote their time to supervision of the children, meeting the needs of the children, and in participation with the children in their activities; S4 was observed on her cell phone while supervising a group of 3 one year olds. Specialist observed S4 on her phone with the 3 one year olds while they were going down for nap. Specialist observed one of the children still awake while S4 was on her phone.

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification Not Met

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Findina:

1723.A.&B. Based on record review: S1 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant/child and adult CPR through training approved by the department. 3 of 9 staff had documentation of this certification.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.C. Based on record review:S1 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department. 3 of 9 staff had documentation of this certification.

1909.l.: Availability of Safety Approved Cribs

Not Met

1909.I.: A safety approved crib shall be available for each infant.

Finding:

1909.I. Based on observations: S2 did not use the approved crib for an infant while asleep. Specialist observed an infant sleeping on a mat in the infant room instead of in an approved crib.

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Statement of Deficiencies

1919.H.: Infants Held While Bottle Fed

Not Met

1919.H.: Infants that cannot hold a bottle shall be held while being bottle-fed. A child shall not be placed lying down on a mat or otherwise with a bottle, sippy cup, etc. A bottle shall not be propped at any time.

Finding:

1919.H. Based on observations: Specialist observed a child placed in a crib with a bottle. The infant fell asleep with the bottle still in the crib with him.
