Statement of Deficiencies

1919-A&B: Food Service and Nutrition - Menu

1919-A&B: All meals and snacks provided by the center, and their preparation, service and storage, shall meet the requirements for meals of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) and 7 C.F.R. 226.20 and the Louisiana Sanitary Code, Title 51, Part XXIII, found at LAC 51:XXXIII. For the current CACFP meal patterns, contact the Louisiana Department of Education, Division of Nutrition Support.

The weekly menu shall:

- be planned for each day of the week and list the specific food items served; 1.
- be prominently posted by the first day of each week and remain posted throughout the week; and 2.
- have substitutions or additions posted on or near the menu. 3.

Finding:

191-A&B.3- Based on record review/ observations: Menu substitutions were not posted on or near the menus as Licensing Specialist observed seven children eating blueberries and graham crackers for snack and the menu listed blueberries and veggie straws as the snack.

1919-D.2: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

1919-D.2: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonsful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

Finding:

1919-D.2 Based on observations: S4 and S5 allowed children under age 4 (seven children age 1 year old) eat whole blueberries that are implicated in choking incidents.

1921-C: Evacuation Pack

1921-C: The center shall have an evacuation pack, the location of which is known to all staff, that at a minimum shall contain:

- 1. a list of area emergency phone numbers;
- a list of emergency contact information and emergency medical authorization for all enrolled children; 2.
- an emergency pick up form; 3.
- first aid supplies, hand sanitizer, wet wipes, and tissue; 4.
- diapers for children who are not toilet trained and plastic bags for diapers; 5.
- a battery powered flashlight and radio and batteries; 6.
- food for children under the age of 4, including infant food and formula; and 7.
- disposable cups and bottled water. 8.

Finding:

1921-C Based on observations: Based on observations, S1 failed to have a completed evacuation pack. S1 failed to have the following: a list of area emergency phone numbers, a list of emergency contact information and emergency medical authorization for all enrolled children, an emergency pick up form, hand sanitizer, wet wipes, and tissue, a battery powered flashlight and radio and batteries, bottled water.
