

## Statement of Deficiencies

### 1725-A.-D.: Medication Management Training

Not Met

- 1725-A.-D.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.  
B. Whether administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration.  
C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved Child Care Health Consultant.  
D. A licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

#### Finding:

1725-A.-D. Based on record review: Whether administering medication or not, there was no documentation of at least two staff members trained in medication administration available for review at the center.

### 1913-A: Water Activity / Water Play Authorization

Not Met

1913-A: The center shall obtain written parental authorization for a child to participate in any water activities or water play activities as those activities are defined in §103.

#### Finding:

1913-A Based on interview and record review: There was no documentation of written parental authorization for a child to participate in water play activities on file at the center. S1 stated the children at the center use water tables as part of their science/math activities.

### 1919-D.2: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

Not Met

1919-D.2: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

#### Finding:

1919-D.2 Based on interview and record review: The children under age 4 are served hard mini pretzels as an afternoon snack on Mondays according to the posted menu at the center. Also, S1 stated the children are served hard mini pretzels as a snack.
