

Statement of Deficiencies

1915-B.&C: Health Services - Parental Notification

Not Met

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B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
2. head or neck or eye injury;
3. human bite that breaks the skin;
4. animal bite;
5. impaled object;
6. broken or dislodged teeth;
7. allergic reaction skin changes (e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.);
8. unusual breathing;
9. symptoms of dehydration;
10. temperature reading over 101° oral, 102° rectal, or 100° axillary; or
11. injury or illness requiring professional medical attention.

Finding:

1915-B.&C: Based on record review: S7 did not have documentation of immediate notification to the parent when the following occurred to a child: C2 was scratched on the face by another child, then hit his head on a bench. Incident occurred at 7:40am on 2/1/17. Form was signed by C2's parent on 2/1/17, but does not have a time listed. S3 did not have documentation of immediate notification to the parent when the following occurred to a child: C1 fell off of a bench and hit her head. Incident occurred on 3/9/17, but does not list a time of occurrence. Form was signed by C1's parent on 3/9/17, but does not have a time listed.
