Results including an explanation from parent and/or child were not documented. The one year old room had only one documented observation on today, 3/30/17 and then none since 11/14/16.

An incident where C8 busted his lip at 5;35 on 1/5/17 and there was no documentation of when parent was notified. C8 also busted his lip on 2/14/17, there was no time documented of when the incident occurred and aprent was notified at 5:00 on 2/14/17.
