# Statement of Deficiencies

1911-K: Hand Washing Not Met

1911-K: Staff and children shall wash their hands using soap at least at the following times: upon arrival at the center, before preparing or serving meals, before giving medication, after playing in water used by more than one person, after toileting, after helping a child use a toilet or changing diapers, after wiping noses or cleaning wounds, after handling pets and other animals, after playing in sandboxes, before eating meals or snacks, upon coming in from outdoors, after cleaning or handling garbage and anytime hands become soiled with body fluids, such as urine, saliva, blood or nasal discharge.

## Finding:

1911-K Based on observations: Staff did not wash their hand with soap as needed. Specialist observed S4 about to pick up an infant after replacing trash can liner and cleaning off changing table. Specialist informed S4 to wash her hands before picking up the infant. S4 washed her hands.

### 1919-D.2: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

**Not Met** 

1919-D.2: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonsful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

#### Finding:

1919-D.2 Based on observations: S1 allowed children under age 4 food that is implicated in choking incidents. Specialist observed S1 serving red beans and sausage rounds for lunch to children under age 4. Sausage rounds were larger than what can be swallowed whole.

## 1919-H: Infants Held While Bottle Fed

Not Met

1919-H: Infants that cannot hold a bottle shall be held while being bottle-fed. A child shall not be placed lying down on a mat or otherwise with a bottle, sippy cup, etc. A bottle shall not be propped at any time.

#### Finding:

1919-H Based on observations: An infant was not held while being bottle-fed. Specialist observed S3 holding an infant and bottle-feeding another infant that was sitting in a bouncer. S3 corrected prior to Specialist departure.
