# Statement of Deficiencies

## 1507-A: Daily Attendance Records - Children

**Not Met** 

1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

#### Finding:

1507-A Based on record review: The Provider lacked documentation of a daily attendance record for children that included the time of arrival and departure of each child and the first and last name of the person to whom the child was released. Center failed to have attendance records 1/19/17 and the week of 3/27/17-3/31/17

## 1715-A.4: Criminal Background Check

**Not Met** 

1715-A.4: Personnel files for each staff member shall be maintained at the center and shall include the following: documentation of a fingerprint based satisfactory criminal background check

#### Finding:

1715-A.4 Based on record review: While the provider obtained a criminal record check for S3, the check was obtained more than 30 calendar days prior to this individual's date of hire (1703.D.1). S3, was hired on 12/28/16 and the check was obtained on 11/18/16.

# 1907-C.2: Sleeping Arrangements Labeled

**Not Met** 

1907-C.2: Individual sleeping accommodations shall be assigned to a child on a permanent basis and labeled, unless the cots or mats are sanitized daily.

#### Finding:

1907-C.2 Based on observations: The sleeping accomodations were not assigned on a permanent basis as the crib was not labeled for the infant.

1911-D: Awake Children Not Met

1911-D: While awake, children shall not remain in a crib, baby bed, swing, high chair, carrier or playpen for more than 30 consecutive minutes.

### Finding:

1911-D Based on observations: S5 was observed leaving C10 in a swing from 10:30am-11:05am which was more than 30 consecutive minutes.

1911-G: Pacifier Attached Not Met

1911-G: Pacifiers attached to strings or ribbons shall not be placed around the neck or attached to the clothing of a child.

### Finding:

1911-G Based on observations: A pacifier that was attached to strings or ribbons was attached to the clothing of a two children.

## 1911-I.-J.: Proper Lifting of a Child

**Not Met** 

1911-L-J.:

- I. Staff members shall adhere to proper techniques for lifting a child.
- Staff members shall not lift a child by one or both arms.

### Finding:

1911-I.-J. Based on observations:Staff did not lift a child using proper lifting techniques, Staff, S5, was observed pulling C11 closer to her while he was playing on the floor, on his stomach, by his left arm.

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# Statement of Deficiencies

## 1915-A: Health Services - Observation

Not Met

1915-A: Observation. Upon arrival at the center, the physical condition of each child shall be observed for possible signs of illness, infections, bruises or injuries, and when something is observed, it shall be documented and such documentation shall include an explanation from the parent or child.

## Finding:

1915-A Based on record review: The provider did not document observations, when something is observed, noted on children upon arrival to the center on a daily basis. Results including an explanation from parent and/or child were not documented on daily basis. Center has not documented a daily observation since 2/1/17.

## 1919-D.2: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

**Not Met** 

1919-D.2: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonsful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

#### Finding

1919-D.2 Based on observations: Children under the age of 4 was observed eating whole grapes as part of the fruit cocktail served for lunch.

1921-E: Tornado Drills Not Met

1921-E: Tornado drills shall be conducted at least once per month in the months of March, April, May, and June at various times of the day necessary to include all children and shall be documented.

#### Finding

1921-E Based on record review: Center's documented tornado drills dated 5/26/16 and 6/13/16 failed to include all staff members present as S1 was present during both drills according to the centers staff attendance logs but failed to document that she was present during the tornado drills.
