

Statement of Deficiencies

1901-J.&K.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

Not Met

1901-J.&K.: Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall be kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children.
1901-L: Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901.J & K Based on Observations: Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, were not kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children; Specialist observed a can of comet cleanser in an unlocked cabinet which is located on top of the toilet in the infant-2 year old classroom. Specialist also observed a can of comet, two cans of glass cleaner a can of disinfectant in the bathroom cabinet in the 3-4 year old classroom. Staff corrected time of survey.

The Center's had a plastic bag that was accessible to children as evidence by: ~Specialist observed plastic bags in a bathroom cabinet in the infant-2 year old classroom. Staff corrected time of survey.

1911-K: Hand Washing

Not Met

1911-K: Staff and children shall wash their hands using soap at least at the following times: upon arrival at the center, before preparing or serving meals, before giving medication, after playing in water used by more than one person, after toileting, after helping a child use a toilet or changing diapers, after wiping noses or cleaning wounds, after handling pets and other animals, after playing in sandboxes, before eating meals or snacks, upon coming in from outdoors, after cleaning or handling garbage and anytime hands become soiled with body fluids, such as urine, saliva, blood or nasal discharge.

Finding:

1911-K Based on observations:

Staff did not wash their hand with soap as needed. Licensing Special observed that staff did not wash their hands after changing diapers, Specialist observed S-4 placed 3 children on a changing table in the infant-2 year old room and S-4 failed to wash her hands in between diaper changes..
