# Statement of Deficiencies

### 1901.J.&K.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

1901.J.&K.: J. Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. K. Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

#### Finding:

1901.J.: Based on observation: The Specialist observed the back bathroom door open with items that can be harmful to children in it, such as cleaning supplies, bleach and two other cleaning solution bottles, that were not kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children.

#### 1901.M.: Strings and Cords

1901.M.: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

## Finding:

1901.M. Based on observations: Strings and cords were accessible to children under age 4 as the Specialist observed a cable cord hanging from the middle of the wall to the floor in the back classroom of the center.

## 1903.C.: Free of Hazards

1903.C.: Indoor and outdoor areas shall be free of hazards.

#### Finding:

1903.C. Based on observations/interview(s):

The indoor and outdoor area were not free of hazards as the Specialists observed a broken window in the back classroom with glass still in the frame, as well as ceiling tiles missing from the back classroom and also the front classroom where 4 children were sleeping. S2 stated that the broken window was due to weather damage and would be repaired later today. The Specialists was told, via telephone, by someone who stated he was the repairman, that he would be out to the center later on 4/25/19 to fix the broken window.
