

Statement of Deficiencies

1719-A.-B.: Orientation Training

Not Met

1719-A.-B.: Within seven calendar days of date of hire, and prior to assuming sole responsibility for any children, each staff member shall receive orientation to the policies and practices of the center that at a minimum shall include:

1. child abuse identification and reporting;
2. emergency preparation;
3. licensing regulations; and
4. safe sleep practices,

Within 30 calendar days of date of hire, each staff member shall receive orientation to the additional policies and practices of the center that at a minimum shall include:

1. child development;
2. child guidance;
3. learning activities;
4. health and safety;
5. shaken baby prevention;

Finding:

Based on record review: Staff S4 date of hire 2/22/16 and Staff S9 date of hire 2/15/16 failed to have documentation of training on current Licensing Regulations, Safe Sleep Practices and Shaken Baby Prevention. Staff hired after July 2015 shall have orientation training on the above mentioned orientation topics within the specified time frame.

1919-C: Food Allergies and Special Diets

Not Met

1919-C: Information regarding food allergies and special diets of children shall be posted in the food preparation area with special care taken to ensure that individual names of children are not in public view. If a parent chooses to allow the center to post the child's name and allergy information in public view, the center shall obtain a signed and dated authorization from the parent.

Finding:

Based on record review and interviews: Information regarding food allergies and special diets of children was posted in the food preparation area, however food service staff mistakenly placed fish on C1's plate during lunch time causing C1's lip to swell. According to staff, C1 did not eat the fish, however the fish being on C1's plate and near other food C1 was eating caused C1's lip to swell. C1 has documented allergies of fish, seafood, eggs, nuts, berries and citrus
