# Statement of Deficiencies

# 1507.A.: Daily Attendance Records - Children

1507.A.: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

#### Finding:

1507.A. Based on observation/record review: The center's daily attendance record for children did not accurately reflect the children on the child care premises at any given time as 14 children were present and 13 children were signed in on the log of classroom #2 of S4 and S5 upon Specialist's arrival at 9:30 a.m. on 5/16/19.

# 1807.C.: CCCBC-Based Determinations of Eligibility for Visitors and Contractors

1807.C.: C. An early learning center shall obtain a CCCBC-based determination of eligibility for child care purposes from the department for each visitor or independent contractor of any kind, and shall have documentation of said determination available at all times for inspection upon request by the licensing division, unless the visitor or independent contractor, other than therapeutic professionals as defined in §103, will be accompanied at all times while at the center when children are present, by an adult staff member who is not being counted in child-to-staff ratios. The center shall have documentation of the accompanying staff member, available at all times for inspection upon request by the Licensing Division.

#### Finding:

1807.C. Based on record review/observation: A CCCBC-based determination of eligibility for child care purposes from the department was not obtained for each independent contractor, O1, prior to the person being present at the center or performing services. The Center did not have documentation of the paid, adult staff member not otherwise counted in child to staff ratios who accompanied O1 at all times while on the center premises. Documentation did not include the language stating that O1 was accompanied by the staff member at all times while on the premises and signature of the staff member. O1 was on the early learning center premises on 4/30/19, 5/2/19, 5/8/19, 5/9/19, 5/14/19 and 5/16/19.

## 1903.C.: Free of Hazards

1903.C.: Indoor and outdoor areas shall be free of hazards.

## Finding:

1903.C. Based on observations: The indoor area was not free of hazards as Specialist observed peeling paint along the interior walls in classrooms #1, #2 and #4. The peeling paint poses a hazard if ingested by the children. S1 stated there is a work order for the classrooms to be repainted this summer while the center is closed.

## 1919.A.&B.: Food Service and Nutrition - Menu

1919.A.&B.: A. All meals and snacks provided by the center, and their preparation, service and storage, shall meet the requirements for meals of the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), 7 CFR 226.20, and LAC 51:XXIII.

- B. The weekly menu shall:
- 1. be planned for each day of the week and list the specific food items served;
- 2. be prominently posted by the first day of each week and remain posted throughout the week; and
- 3. have substitutions or additions posted on or near the menu.

#### Finding:

1919-B. Based on record review/observation: Menu substitutions or additions were not posted on or near the menus as the center's weekly menu specified tomato sauce with meatballs served over spaghetti pasta, mixed vegetables, diced pears with milk. Specialist observed spaghetti with tomato sauce and meatballs, mixed vegetables, orange slices and milk being served for lunch on 5/16/19.

# Statement of Deficiencies

# 1921.A.: Emergency Preparedness and Evacuation Planning

1921.A.: Emergency and Evacuation Plan. The director shall consult with appropriate state and local authorities and shall establish and follow a written multi-hazard emergency and evacuation plan to protect children in the event of emergencies that at a minimum shall:

1. address any potential disaster related to the area in which the center is located;

2. include procedures for sheltering in place, lockdown and evacuation to a pre-determined site for potential threats to the safety, health and well-being of children in care;

3. include specific procedures for handling infants through two year olds, including food and formula;

4. include specific procedures for handling children with special needs, including the evacuation and transportation of children in wheelchairs;

5. include a system to account for all children;

6. include a system, and a back-up system, for contacting parents and authorized third party release caretakers;

7. include a system to reunite children and parents following an emergency;

8. include procedures for providing information about the emergency plan to parents at the time of enrollment and when changes occur;

9. be reviewed annually for accuracy and updated as changes occur; and

10. be reviewed with all staff at least once per year.

11. practice drills shall be conducted at least twice per year to include all children and shall be documented.

# Finding:

1921.A. Based on record review: S1 failed to conduct and document practice drills at least twice per year.
