

Statement of Deficiencies

1915-B.&C: Health Services - Parental Notification

Not Met

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B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
2. head or neck or eye injury;
3. human bite that breaks the skin;
4. animal bite;
5. impaled object;
6. broken or dislodged teeth;
7. allergic reaction skin changes (e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.);
8. unusual breathing;
9. symptoms of dehydration;
10. temperature reading over 101° oral, 102° rectal, or 100° axillary; or
11. injury or illness requiring professional medical attention.

Finding:

1915- B. Based on record review and interviews: Center failed to document and report an incident/accident that occurred no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence. According to a critical report submitted to Licensing State office an incident occurred at the center on 5/15/17 in which C1 had an incident/accident on the playground and center staff failed to report it to the parent no later than when the child was released to their parent. O1 contacted the center after the child was released to her on 5/15/17 when she noticed her unusual behavior and that is when the center advised her of the incident that occurred earlier in the day. The incident documentation was completed after the parent notified the center on 5/15/17.
