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Statement of Deficiencies

1503-D: Waiver of Liability Not Met

1503-D: Parents shall not be required to waive the center's responsibility.

Finding:

1503-D Based on record review: Provider failed to ensure that parents are not required to waive center's liability as evidenced by children's records all contain a form signed by parents which waives center's liability and also parents acknowledge their (parents') responsibility for payment of medical services.

1507-A: Daily Attendance Records - Children

Not Met

1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507-A Based on record review: Daily attendance records for children failed to always include time of departure and person to whom child is released.

**Provider lacked attendance records for school-agers for before and after school.

1715-A.2: Photo Identification

Not Met

1715-A.2: Staff Members. Personnel files for each staff member shall be maintained at the center and shall include the following: copy of a state or federal government issued photo identification;

Finding:

1715-A.2 Based on record review: Provider lacks evidence of photo identification as required for S19.

1717-A: Independent Contractors Records

Not Met

1717-A: Independent Contractors. The following information shall be maintained for all independent contractors, including but not limited to therapeutic professionals, extracurricular personnel, contracted transportation drivers, Department of Education, Office of Early Childhood staff and local school district staff:

- 1. an information form that includes the person's name, address and phone number
- 2. a list of duties performed while present at the center; and
- 3. documentation of a fingerprint based satisfactory criminal background check dated prior to the individual being present at the center or documentation of the paid, adult staff member not otherwise counted in child to staff ratios that accompanied the contractor at all times while the contractor was on the center premises, to include the date, contractor arrival and departure time, language stating that the contractor was accompanied by the staff member at all times while on the premises, and the signature of both the contractor and the accompanying staff member.

Finding:

1717-A Based on record review: *Provider fails to have the required information for independent contractors O1 who visited the center 5/3/16, 5/10/16, 5/17/16, and 5/24/16; for O3 who visited center 4/29/16; and for O2 who visited center on 5/23/16, 5/24/16, and 5/25/16. ** Provider lacks evidence of criminal background check or evidence of accompanying staff with children while visiting tumble bus with O1, taking pictures with O2, and during speech therapy with O3.

1719-C: Orientation Training - Transportation staff

Not Met

1719-C: All staff members responsible for transporting children shall receive additional orientation training in the following areas prior to assuming their transportation duties:

- 1. transportation regulations, including the modeling of how to properly conduct a vehicle passenger check and demonstration by staff to director on how to conduct a vehicle passenger check;
- proper use of child safety restraints required by state Law;
- 3. proper loading, unloading, and tracking of children as required by state law;
- 4. location of first aid supplies: and
- 5. emergency procedures for the vehicle, including actions to be taken in the event of accidents or breakdowns.

Finding:

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Statement of Deficiencies

1719-C Based on record review: There failed be evidence of S17 whose duties include driving, has received additional training as required for transportation staff as per Bulletin 137.

1901-N: Strings and Cords

Not Met

1901-N: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

Finding:

1901-N Based on observations: Cord was observed hanging and accessible to children in 2 year old class.

1907-B.1-4: Eating Practices Not Met

1907-B.1-4:

- Developmentally appropriate seating shall be used.
- 2. Chairs and tables of suitable size shall be available for each child.
- 3. Feeding tables may be used at mealtimes, if children's feet are able to rest comfortably on a foot rest.
- 4. Feeding tables may also be used for occasional program activities that require a table surface for no longer than 30 minutes in one day in addition to mealtime minutes.

Finding:

1907-B.1-4 Based on observations: Feeding table utilized for infants failed to be equipped with a foot rest.

1907-E.2: Cribs Free of Toys and Other Soft or Loose Bedding

Not Met

1907-E.2: Cribs shall be free of toys and other soft or loose bedding, including comforters, blankets, sheets, bumper pads, pillows, stuffed animals and wedges when the child is in the crib.

Finding:

1907-E.2 Based on observations: Infants were observed in cribs with loose blankets and one with a stuffed animal.

1915-A: Health Services - Observation

Not Met

1915-A: Observation. Upon arrival at the center, the physical condition of each child shall be observed for possible signs of illness, infections, bruises or injuries, and when something is observed, it shall be documented and such documentation shall include an explanation from the parent or child.

Finding:

1915-A Based on record review: Provider failed to always document explanations as required from parent or child when bruises or something is noted upon child's arrival at center.

1917-H: Medication Administration Records

Not Met

1917-H: Medication administration records shall be maintained for all children regardless of who administers the medication. Records shall include the following:

- 1. name of the child and medication name and dosage administered;
- 2. date and time medication administered;
- 3. documentation of telephone contact with parent prior to giving "as needed" medication;
- 4. signature of person administering medication or witnessing the child administering own medication;
- 5. signature of person completing the form; and
- 6. when a parent administers medication to his/her own child on center premises, the medication administration record shall be documented by either the parent or a staff member.

Finding:

1917-H Based on record review: Provider failed to have evidence of telephone contact with parent prior to giving "as needed" medication to children.

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Statement of Deficiencies

1919-A&B: Food Service and Nutrition - Menu

Not Met

1919-A&B: All meals and snacks provided by the center, and their preparation, service and storage, shall meet the requirements for meals of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) and 7 C.F.R. 226.20 and the Louisiana Sanitary Code, Title 51, Part XXIII, found at LAC 51:XXXIII. For the current CACFP meal patterns, contact the Louisiana Department of Education, Division of Nutrition Support.

The weekly menu shall:

- be planned for each day of the week and list the specific food items served;
- 2. be prominently posted by the first day of each week and remain

b>posted</br>
 /b> throughout the week; and
- 3. have substitutions or additions posted on or near the menu.

Finding:

1919-A&B: Based on observation: *Today's lunch meal failed to meet nutritional standards as evidenced by no fruit/vegetable component was offered and only chicken, pasta, bread, and milk was served. ** Current week's menu failed to be posted; ***Menu of previous meals lacked evidence of milk being always served with meals/snacks.

2107-B.1-3: Field Trip Visual Vehicle Check

Not Met

2107-B.1-3: For field trips, each vehicle shall have a visual passenger check and a face-to-name count conducted at all of the following times:

- 1. prior to leaving center for destination,
- 2. upon arrival at and prior to departure from each destination, and
- 3. upon return to center.

Finding:

2107-B.1-3 Based on record review: provider lacked evidence of visual check as required for field trip taken 10/15/15.

2109-A: Non-vehicular Excursions - Parental Authorization

Not Met

2109-A: Written parental authorization shall be obtained for all non-vehicular excursions. Authorization shall include the name of the child, type and location of the activity, date and signature of the parent, and shall be updated at least annually.

Finding:

2109-A Based on record review: Provider lacked written parental authorization on non-vehicular excursion taken on today's date as three and four year olds on this day were observed engaged on bikes in the center's parking lot shared by other businesses (which is not included in fenced area) yet no written parental authorization for such.

2109-B: Non-vehicular Excursions - Records

Not Met

2109-B: Centers shall maintain records of all non-vehicular excursion activities to include the date, time, list of children, staff, and other adults, and type of activity.

Finding:

2109-B Based on record review: Provider lacked no record as required of non-vehicular excursion taken on this date to include: date, time, list of children, staff, and other adults, and type of activity.
