

Statement of Deficiencies

1915.B.&C.: Health Services - Parental Notification

Not Met

1915.B.&C.:

B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
2. head or neck or eye injury;
3. human bite that breaks the skin;
4. animal bite;
5. impaled object;
6. broken or dislodged teeth;
7. allergic reaction skin changes (e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.);
8. unusual breathing;
9. symptoms of dehydration;
10. temperature reading over 101° oral, 102° rectal, or 100° axillary; or
11. injury or illness requiring professional medical attention.

Finding:

1915 B & C Based on record review/interviews: There was no documentation of immediate notification to the parent when the following occurred to a child:

- On 06/01/2020, a child was scratched on the neck at 10:50am. There was no time of parental notification documented.
- On 02/03/2020, a child jumped and bit his lip at 4:46pm. There was no time of parental notification documented.

The Provider's documentation of incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior did not have documentation that it was reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence. According to documentation, the following occurred:

- On 05/26/2020, a child was bit by a friend at 9:40 am. Documentation does not indicate where the child was bit on their body. There was no time of parental notification documented.

Corrective Action Plan: S1, the director, stated she will now "call out" to staff from her room to indicate who was contacted and what time they were contacted so that both can be documented on the child's form by the teacher. S1 stated this will go into effect today, 06/01/2020.
