# Statement of Deficiencies

## 1507.A.: Daily Attendance Records - Children

Not Met

1507.A.: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

#### Finding:

1507.A. Based on observations/record review: The center's daily attendance record for children did not accurately reflect the children on the child care premises at any given time as Specialist observed at 10:40am, there were 74 children present in the center and 71 children were signed in on the attendance log. Specialist observed in S15's 4 year old class, there were 10 children present and 8 signed in, and in S13's 1 year old class, there were 13 children present and 12 signed in on the log.

## 1725.A.-C.: Medication Management Training

**Not Met** 

1725.A.-C.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.

- B. Whether the center is administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration and at least one on the premises. A staff member who is a licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.
- C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved child care health consultant.

### Finding:

1725.A.-C. Based on record review: During the visit in the Center at 3:20pm, Specialist reviewed the Medication Authorization Form for C11 and observed S12 documented that prescription ear drops were administered to C11 on 5/30/19 and 5/31/19. S12 did not have current documentation of training in medication administration completed with an approved Child Care Health Consultant. Training is required every two years and the staff's training expired in March of 2019.
