

## Statement of Deficiencies

### 713.A: Office of Public Health, State Fire, City Fire, Office of Early Childhood approval

Not Met

713.A: Current approvals by the Office of Public Health, Office of State Fire Marshal, City Fire (if applicable), Office of Early Childhood and the Licensing Division shall be required before the expiration of an existing license.

#### Finding:

713.A Based on record review: The Provider lacked documentation of a current annual inspection and approval from the City Fire Department. The date of the last approval expired 04/30/2017.

### 1509-A.8. a-b: Behavior Management Policy

Not Met

1509-A.8. a-b: Behavior Management Policy

Each center shall develop and implement a written behavior management policy describing the methods of behavior guidance and management that shall be used at the center.

The behavior management policy shall prohibit children from being subject to any of the following:

- i. physical or corporal punishment which includes but is not limited to yelling, slapping, spanking, yanking, shaking, pinching, exposure to extreme temperatures or other measures producing physical pain, putting anything in the mouth of a child, requiring a child to exercise, or placing a child in an uncomfortable position.
- ii. verbal abuse, which includes but is not limited to using offensive or profane language, telling a child to "shut up", or making derogatory remarks about children or family members of children in the presence of children;
- iii. the threat of a prohibited action even if there is no intent to follow through with the threat;
- iv. being disciplined by another child;
- v. being bullied by another child;
- vi. being deprived of food or beverages;
- vii. being restrained by devices such as high chairs or feeding tables for disciplinary purposes; and
- viii. having active play time withheld for disciplinary purposes, except timeout may be used during active play time for an infraction incurred during the playtime.

#### Finding:

1509-A.8. a-b Based on record review: The provider's Behavior Management policy did not include:

- v. being bullied by another child;
- vii. being restrained by devices such as high chairs or feeding tables for disciplinary purposes; and
- viii. having active play time withheld for disciplinary purposes, except timeout may be used during active play time for an infraction incurred during the playtime.

### 1509-A.8.c: Behavior Management Policy - Time Out

Not Met

1509-A.8.c: Time Out

- i. Time out shall not be used for children under age 2.
- ii. A time out shall take place within sight of staff.
- iii. The length of each time out shall be based on the age of the child and shall not exceed 1 minute per year of age.
- iv. For children over age six, a time out may be extended beyond 1 minute per year of age, if a signed and dated statement, including a maximum time limit, from the parent granting such permission, is on file at the center.

#### Finding:

1509-A.8.c Based on record review: The provider's Behavior Management Policy-Time Out did not include the following:

1. Time out shall not be used for children under age 2.
- ii. A time out shall take place within sight of staff.
- iii. The length of each time out shall be based on the age of the child and shall not exceed 1 minute per year of age.
- iv. For children over age six, a time out may be extended beyond 1 minute per year of age, if a signed and dated statement, including a maximum time limit, from the parent granting such permission, is on file at the center.

### 1715-A.5: State Central Registry

Not Met

1715-A.5: Personnel files for each staff member shall be maintained at the center and shall include the following: documentation of a current, completed state central registry disclosure form indicating no justified (valid) finding of abuse or neglect by the DCFS, or a current determination from the DCFS indicating that the individual does not pose a risk to children.

#### Finding:

1715-A.5 Based on record review: Provider failed to have documentation of a completed state central registry disclosure form (SCR 1) on site and

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available for review at the center prior to a previously completed form expiring (1705.B). Three out of seven staff, S3, S6 and S7 failed to have documentation of the completed form.

### 1725-A.-D.: Medication Management Training

**Not Met**

- 1725-A.-D.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.  
B. Whether administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration.  
C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved Child Care Health Consultant.  
D. A licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

#### Finding:

1725-A.-D. Based on record review: The provider did not show documented proof of at least two staff members trained in medication administration.

### 2101-A.15: Transportation - Contract to Provide Transportation

**Not Met**

2101-A.15: Centers using contract transportation shall maintain a copy of the written contract that includes an express provision stating that the contractor shall comply with all state laws and regulations, as amended, regarding motor vehicles, including but not limited to seat belts and child restraints.

#### Finding:

2101-A.15 Based on record review:

The Provider did not show written documentation of its Field Trip contract. The contractual agreement is required to be signed by the provider and a representative of the transportation agency outlining circumstances under which transportation will be provided and that includes an express provision stating that the contractor shall comply with all state laws and regulations, as amended, regarding motor vehicles, including but not limited to seat belts and child restraints.
