1715-A.4 Based on record review: Documentation of a satisfactory fingerprint based criminal background check (CBC) was not available for 1 of 9 staff, prior to the individual(s) being present in the childcare facility. S3s right to review expired on 6/13/18. S3 was present at the time of survey. S1 asked S3 to leave the premises and sent S3 to complete a new CCCBC prior to the end of survey.

1723-A.&B.: CPR Certification

1723-A.&B.: Infant and child CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR.

1901-G.-H.: G. All equipment used by children shall be maintained in a clean and safe condition and in good repair. H. Moveable equipment shall be secured and supported so that it shall not fall or tip over.

Finding:

1901-G.-H. Based on observations: All of the center equipment used by children was not in safe condition and in good repair. Specialist observed two tricycles on the centers play yard that were missing pedals, exposing the iron rode that the pedal should go on for a child to pedal the tricycle.

1915-B.&C:

B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

- 1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
- 2. head or neck or eye injury;
- 3. human bite that breaks the skin;
- 4. animal bite;
- 5. impaled object;
- 6. broken or dislodged teeth;

1919-D.2: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

1919-D.2: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonsful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

1919-D.2 Based on observations:Center staff allowed children under age 4 to have fruit cocktail with whole grapes. Whole grapes are implicated in choking incidents. Center staff corrected deficiency during survey.
