

Statement of Deficiencies

1901-J.-K.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

Not Met

1901-J.-K.: J. Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall be kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children.
K. Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901-J.-K. Based on observations: Items that can be harmful to children, such as cleaning supplies and chemicals, were not kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. Specialist observed a spray bottle of Lysol cleaner on a small table near the door of the bathroom located next to the infant room. The bathroom is used by the 3 to 5 year old children. Corrected before departure.

1911-E: Daily Reports for Infants

Not Met

1911-E: Daily Reports for Infants. Written reports that include the liquid intake, food intake, disposition, bowel movements and eating and sleeping patterns shall be given to the parents of infants on a daily basis. Reports shall be kept current throughout the day.

Finding:

1911-E Based on record review: The provider lacked a daily written report for 4 of 4 infants observed by Specialist on 7/18/18.

1921-E: Tornado Drills

Not Met

1921-E: Tornado drills shall be conducted at least once per month in the months of March, April, May, and June at various times of the day necessary to include all children and shall be documented.

Finding:

1921-E Based on record review: The provider did not have documentation of tornado drills that were conducted at least once per month during the months of March, April, May, and June. Date of last tornado drills was 3/19/18.

2101-A.14: Vehicle - Liability Insurance

Not Met

2101-A.14: Centers shall maintain at all times current commercial liability insurance for the operation of center vehicles to ensure medical coverage for children in event of accident or injury. This policy shall extend coverage to any staff member who provides transportation for any child in the course and scope of his/her employment. The provider is responsible for payment of medical expenses of a child injured while in the center's care. Documentation shall consist of the insurance policy or current binder that includes the name of the early learning center, the name of the insurance company, policy number, period of coverage and explanation of coverage. If transportation is provided by parents for field trips or transportation is provided by contract, whether daily of field trip, a copy of the current liability insurance shall be maintained on file at the center.

Finding:

2101-A.14 Based on record review: The Provider did not maintain documentation of the contract provider's current liability insurance. Transportation is provided field trips only and a field trip was taken on 7/13/18.

2101-A.15: Transportation - Contract to Provide Transportation

Not Met

2101-A.15: Centers using contract transportation shall maintain a copy of the written contract that includes an express provision stating that the contractor shall comply with all state laws and regulations, as amended, regarding motor vehicles, including but not limited to seat belts and child restraints.

Finding:

2101-A.15 Based on record review: The Provider contracted for transportation and there was not a contract signed by the provider and a representative of the transportation agency outlining circumstances under which transportation will be provided and that includes an express provision stating that the contractor shall comply with all state laws and regulations, as amended, regarding motor vehicles, including but not limited to seat belts and child restraints.

Statement of Deficiencies

2105-E: Field Trip - Record

Not Met

2105-E: A written record for each field trip shall be maintained and shall include the following:

1. date, destination(s) and method of transportation;
2. names of all the children being transported in each vehicle;
3. names of the driver, staff members and other adults being transported in each vehicle;
4. names of other adults who joined the field trip at the destination(s) to assist with supervision of children; and
5. the presence of each child each time the children enter or exit the vehicle.

Finding:

2105-E Based on record review: The Provider did not maintain a record of all field trips taken. A field trip was taken on 7/13/18.

2107-B.1-3: Field Trip Visual Vehicle Check

Not Met

2107-B.1-3: For field trips, each vehicle shall have a visual passenger check and a face-to-name count conducted at all of the following times:

1. prior to leaving center for destination,
2. upon arrival at and prior to departure from each destination, and
3. upon return to center.

Finding:

2107-B.1-3 Based on record review: For field trips, a face-to-name count was not conducted prior to leaving facility for destination, when destination is reached, before departing destination for return to facility, and upon return to facility to ensure that no child was left on the trip as evidenced by no documentation of visual checks being completed on the field trip of 7/13/18.
