Statement of Deficiencies

1903.C.: Free of Hazards

Not Met

1903.C.: Indoor and outdoor areas shall be free of hazards.

Finding:

1903.C. Based on record review/interview: Specialist interviewed S1 at 11:30 am who stated that the center participated in a "beach day" on 6/13/19 in which a tarp was placed on the ground as part of the "beach day" set up. Specialist determined that the tarp was a hazard due to it getting hot enough to burn C1, C2 and possibly C3's feet. C1, age one, had on clear jelly style shoes during the time of the incident and was taken to the doctor on 6/13/2019 due to blisters forming under her feet. C2, age two, had blisters on her feet from stepping on the tarp with no shoes on. C2 was taken to the doctor and was advised that the blisters were caused by walking on a hot surface. C3's mother called S1 on 6/13/2019 after leaving the center with C3, age two, and asked if anything happened at the center because C3 who had tennis shoes on during the "beach day"activity was walking funny. S1 stated nothing was obseved on C3 prior to him leaving the center.
