

Statement of Deficiencies

1711.A.&B.&F.&G.: Child to Staff Ratio

Not Met

1711.A.&B.&F.&G.:

- A. Child to staff ratios are established to ensure the safety of all children.
- B. Minimum child to staff ratios shall be met at all times.
 - 1. There shall be a minimum of two staff members present at an early learning center when more than one child is present.
 - 2. Only those staff members directly providing care, supervision or guidance to children shall be counted in the child to staff ratios.
- F. Minimum Child to Staff Ratios for Type I centers:

- G. Mixed Age Groups - Minimum Child to Staff Ratios
 - 1. An average of the child to staff ratios may be applied to mixed age groups of children ages 2, 3, 4 and 5.
 - 2. Child to staff ratios for children under age two are excluded from averaging.
 - 3. When a mixed age group includes children younger than age two, the age of the youngest child determines the child to staff ratio for the group.
 - 4. An average may be applied to a mixed age group consisting only of children ages 5 and older.

Finding:

1711.B.&F.G.:Based on observation on 7/18/19 at 10:27 am, S1 failed to meet the required child to staff ratio as LS observed S1 and S2 supervising 20 children ages (3mths - 5 yrs) during the center walk through. S1 documented on the children daily attendance that there were (4) infants, (5) 1 yr olds, (6) 2yr olds, (3) 4yr olds, and (2) 5 yrs in S1 and S2's classroom. S1 called S4 to come and assist with supervision and child to staff ratio. LS observed S4 arriving to the center at 10:42 am.

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

Not Met

- 1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.
- B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A.&B.: Based on record review/interview on 7/18/19 at 11:57 am, S1 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant, child, and adult CPR through training approved by the department as evidenced by 1 out of 3 staff, present had current CPR certification. S1 stated that S2 nor S3 had CPR training because she thought only 50% of the staff members "hired" had to have CPR training and was unaware that 50% of staff on the premises was required to have CPR training. S1 was the only staff on the premises with documentation of this certification. When S4 arrived to the center at 10:42 am, the center was compliant with CPR training.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.C. Based on record review/interview on 7/18/19 at 11:57 am, S1 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department as evidenced by 1 out of 3 staff, present had documentation of this certification. S1 stated that S2 nor S3 had CPR training because she thought only 50% of the staff members "hired" had to have Pediatric First Aid training and was unaware that 50% of staff on the premises was required to have Pediatric First Aid training. S1 was the only staff on the premises with documentation of this certification. When S4 arrived to the center at 10:42 , the center was compliant with Pediatric First Aid training.
