1501-A: Operations Not Met

1501-A: A center shall operate within the licensed capacity, age range, hours of operation and other specific services designated on its license.

Finding:

1501-A Based on interview(s): The center did not operate within licensed space as follows: In mid-morning on 7/24/18, the air conditioning failed in two 3 year old classrooms. The two classes were moved to the Center for Innovation and Design on the school campus. The Center for Innovation and Design is not licensed space. The parents were notified by email and direct internal messaging system that the children had been moved. The air conditioning is in the process of being repaired. It is expected that the children will return to their classrooms on 7/26/18. The Licensing Division was notified of this situation on 7/25/18 during the licensing visit. The air conditioning system began to function during the licensing visit.

1907-E.2: Cribs Free of Toys and Other Soft or Loose Bedding

Not Met

1907-E.2: Cribs shall be free of toys and other soft or loose bedding, including comforters, blankets, sheets, bumper pads, pillows, stuffed animals and wedges when the child is in the crib.

Finding:

1907-E.2 Based on observations:

The center's cribs were not free of toys or other soft or loose bedding (including comforters, blankets, sheets, bumper pads, pillows, stuffed animals and wedges) while the child was in the crib as evidence by: during the initial walk through of the Center at 10:50 am, by the Licensing Specialist two infants were observed sleeping in cribs with loose blankets and one stuffed animal. This was corrected immediately.

1909-C: Infants - Positioning Devices

Not Met

1909-C: Infants shall not be placed in positioning devices, unless the center has written authorization from a physician to use a positioning device.

Finding:

1909-C Based on observations: During the iniital walk through of the Center at 10:50 am, the Licensing Specialist observed two infants sleeping in bouncy chairs. The center did not have written authorization from a physician to use this device for sleeping. This was immediately corrected.
