

Statement of Deficiencies

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

Not Met

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A: Based on Specialist's review of records on 7/26/19 at 10:45 AM, Specialist reviewed records and noted that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department. 3 of 8 staff had documentation of this certification. One additional staff member with the approved training for certification in infant and child CPR was needed to be in compliance.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A: Based on Specialist's review of records on 7/26/19 at 10:45 AM, Specialist reviewed records and noted that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department. 3 of 8 staff had documentation of this certification. One additional staff member with the approved training for certification in Pediatric First Aid was needed to be in compliance.

1919.D.2.: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

Not Met

1919.D.2.: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

Finding:

1919.D.2. Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards. Based on observations: On 7/26/2019 at 11:30 AM, Specialist observed that the Provider allowed children under age 4 to eat raw carrot rounds, which are implicated in choking incidents. 3 of 7 children in the classroom of S4 were observed eating raw carrot rounds served as a part of the lunch.
