1707.A.1.& 2.: Based on record review/interview: On 7/31/19 at 10:00am the center did not have a qualified Director who is an on-site full time staff person at the center during the day time hours of operation (prior to 9:00 p.m.) and responsible for planning, managing, and controlling the center's daily activities, as well as responding to parental concerns and ensuring that minimum licensing requirements are met.; there was not an on-site full time qualified Director Designee given responsibility for planning, managing, and controlling the center's daily activities, as well as responding to parental concerns and ensuring that minimum licensing requirements are met. The center has been operating without a director or designee from 05/28/19 to present.
