Finding:

Based on record review: The Provider lacked documentation of a current annual inspection and approval from Office of Public Health, State Fire Marshal, and Office of Early Childhood. The provider did not have documentation of last approval during licensing visit.

1723-A.&B.: CPR Certification Not Met

1723-A.&B.: A - Infant and child CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR.

B - Adult CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR.

Finding:

Based on record review: The Provider did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant and child CPR. 0 of 3 staff had current documentation of this certification. CPR certifications on file expired 8/6/16.

1723-C.-D.: Pediatric First Aid Not Met

1723-C.-D.:

C. Pediatric First Aid - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in Pediatric First Aid.

D. Certification - A copy of the certification for each such staff member shall be on-site at all times and available for inspection by the Licensing

Finding:

Based on record review: The Provider did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid. 0 of 3 staff had documentation of this certification. PFA certifications on file expired 8/6/16.

1725-A.-D.: Medication Management Training

Not Met

1725-A.-D.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.

- B. Whether administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration.
- C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved Child Care Health Consultant.
- D. A licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

Finding:

Based on record review: The provider did not have at least two staff members trained in medication administration whether the early learning center administers medication or not.

1903-E.5: Outdoor - Enclosed

1903-E.5: Outdoor play space shall be enclosed with a permanent fence or other permanent barrier in a manner that protects children from traffic hazards, prevents children from leaving the premises without proper supervision, and prevents contact with animals or unauthorized persons.

Finding:

Based on observation and interview: Front Outdoor play space lacked enclosure with a permanent fence or other permanent barrier in a manner that protects children from traffic hazards, prevents children from leaving the premises without proper supervision, and prevents contact with animals or unauthorized persons. Children and staff go in front concrete area of the center to play with chalk and bubbles. This area must be enclosed with a permanent fence or other permanent barrier that protects children from traffic, hazards, prevents children from the leaving the premises without proper supervision and prevents contact with animals or unauthorized persons.

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Statement of Deficiencies

1907-C.2: Sleeping Arrangements Labeled

Not Met

1907-C.2: Individual sleeping accommodations shall be assigned to a child on a permanent basis and labeled, unless the cots or mats are sanitized daily.

Finding:

Based on observation and interview: Each child's sleeping accommodations were not assigned to him/her on a permanent basis as there were 3 infants present with 2 cribs in the infant room.
