1711.H.: Rest Time - Minimum Child to Staff Ratio

1711.H.: Rest Time - Minimum Child to Staff Ratios

- 1. Sufficient staffing needed to satisfy child to staff ratios shall be present on the premises during rest time and available to assist as needed.
- 2. Children ages one and older may be grouped together at rest time with one staff member in each room supervising the resting children.

Finding:

1711.H. Based on observations on 08/17/19 at 1:28 pm, S3 had children under the age of one grouped together with older children at rest time. As specialist observed S3 supervising 3 children under the age of one with eight 1 year olds. S3 stated that the group of 1 year olds were assigned to S4 who was in another classroom filling in for S7 who had left the center to go on break at 12:55 pm. This was corrected at 1:32 pm when S5 joined S3 in the classroom.

1725.A.-C.: Medication Management Training

1725.A.-C.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.

B. Whether the center is administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration and at least one on the premises. A staff member who is a licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved child care health consultant.

Finding:

1725.A.-C. Based on interviews on 08/13/19, S1 did not have at least two staff members trained with medication administration whether the early learning center administers medication or not. There were no staff with this current certification. S1 stated that they had a class scheduled for 07/12/2019, but it was canceled by NSU. She stated that it has been rescheduled for 08/29/19. (previously sited on 05/29/19 and 06/24/19)
