1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507-A Based on record review: Daily attendance is not maintained as all records do not include arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released; Based on review of the daily attendance record for 06/24/16, 36 children were signed in and none were signed out.

1507-B: Daily Attendance Records - Staff and Owners

1507-B: A daily attendance record for all staff members and owners shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the first and last name of the staff member or owner and arrival and departure times;
- 2. accurately reflect the staff members and owners on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to document staff members and owners who leave and return to the center during the day

Finding:

1507-B Based on record review: Based on review of staff daily attendance, staff daily attendance is not maintained as staff are signing in, but not signing out. Based on review of staff daily attendance for 06/24/16 there were 7 staff members present of the 7 present 4 staff did not sign out.

1721-A. - C.: Continuing Education Training

1721-A. - C.: Early learning centers shall provide opportunities for continuing education of staff members. The center staff of Type III centers, excluding Foster Grandparents, shall obtain a minimum of 12 clock hours of training annually in the topics found in §1719(A) and (B) conducted by trainers approved by the Licensing Division. The Licensing Division shall keep a registry of approved trainers.

B. These Hours are in addition to the 3 hours required for health and safety.

C. Copies of certificates of completion or attendance records shall be maintained at the center and available for inspection by the Licensing Division upon request.

Finding:

1721-A. - C. Based on record review: Documentation of the minimum of 12 clock hours of training annually in the topics found in §1719(A) and (B) conducted by trainers approved by the Licensing Division plus the additional 3 hours required for health and safety. S1 could not located the 2014-2015 training hours for S3 and S5.

1723-A.&B.: CPR Certification

1723-A.&B.: A - Infant and child CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR.

B - Adult CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR.

Finding:

1723-A.&B.: Based on record review: The Provider did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant and child CPR. 1 of 5 staff present on 08/22/16 had documentation of this certification. The Provider did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the premises and accessible to the children, whichever is less, have current certification in a staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in adult CPR. 1 of 5 staff staff present on 08/22/16 had documentation of this certification.

Based on record review: The Provider did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid. 1 of 5 staff present on 08/22/16 had documentation of this certification.

1915-A: Health Services - Observation

1915-A: Observation. Upon arrival at the center, the physical condition of each child shall be observed for possible signs of illness, infections, bruises or injuries, and when something is observed, it shall be documented and such documentation shall include an explanation from the parent or child.

Finding:

1915-A Based on interview(s): S1 states that she can't locate any daily obseravations.

2101-A.1: Transportation Arrangement Conforms to State Laws

2101-A.1: Transportation arrangements shall conform to all state laws, as amended, including but not limited to those requiring the use of seat belts and child restraints.

Finding:

2101-A.1 Based on observations: The Provider's transportation arrangements did not conform to state laws, as the vehicle registartion expired April 2016. S1 states that vehicle has not been used to transport children since last school year ended.
