Statement of Deficiencies

1507-A: Daily Attendance Records - Children

1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507-A Based on observations/record review: The center's daily attendance record for children did not accurately reflect the children on the child care premises at any given time as 32 children were present and 29 children were signed in on the log.

1509-A.4: Disclosure of Information Policy

1509-A.4: Disclosure of Information Policy that provides notice to parents of the licensing authority of the Licensing Division and the availability of licensing surveys/inspections, regulations and information regarding early learning centers from the Department of Education's website.

Finding:

1509-A.4 Based on record review/interview(s): The Provider did not have a Policy/Procedure to provide notice to parents of the licensing authority of the Licensing Division and the availability of licensing surveys/inspections, regulations and information regarding early learning centers from the Department of Education's website. Specialist reviewed the Provider's Disclosure of Information policy; however, this policy dealt with confidentiality and did not list the requried information. S1 stated that she was unaware of this policy and will compose one as soon as possible.

1911-K: Hand Washing

1911-K: Staff and children shall wash their hands using soap at least at the following times: upon arrival at the center, before preparing or serving meals, before giving medication, after playing in water used by more than one person, after toileting, after helping a child use a toilet or changing diapers, after wiping noses or cleaning wounds, after handling pets and other animals, after playing in sandboxes, before eating meals or snacks, upon coming in from outdoors, after cleaning or handling garbage and anytime hands become soiled with body fluids, such as urine, saliva, blood or nasal discharge.

Finding:

1911-K Based on observations: Staff did not wash their hands with soap and water as needed as Specialist observed that staff did not wash their hands after each diaper change. Specialist observed S3 change the diaper of a one year old boy and immediately begin to change the diaper of a one year old girl without first removing her gloves and washing her hands with soap and water.

1921-E: Tornado Drills

1921-E: Tornado drills shall be conducted at least once per month in the months of March, April, May, and June at various times of the day necessary to include all children and shall be documented.

Finding:

1921-E Based on record review/interview(s): The provider did not have documentation of tornado drills that were conducted at least once per month during the months of March, April, May, and June as the Provider failed to have documentation of a tornado drill completed in the month of June. S1 stated that a Tornado drill was completed in June; however, she failed to complete the documentation of it.
