1507.A.: Daily Attendance Records - Children

Not Met

1507.A.: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507.A.: Based on record review at approximately 10:15 a.m., the children's attendance records from 8/31/2022 to 9/1/2022 failed to include the following:

- -arrival times for 1 of 64 children on 9/1/2022;
- -departure times for 1 of 61 children on 8/31/2022; and
- -first and last names of persons or entities to whom children were released for 8 of 61 children on 8/31/2022.

CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN: Effective 9/1/2022, S1 will review daily attendance procedures with all staff by 9/2/2022 to ensure compliance with this regulation.

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification - Infant/Child

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. All staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. All staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.
