

## Statement of Deficiencies

### 1915.B.&C.: Health Services - Parental Notification

Not Met

1915.B.&C.:

B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
2. head or neck or eye injury;
3. human bite that breaks the skin;
4. animal bite;
5. impaled object;
6. broken or dislodged teeth;
7. allergic reaction skin changes (e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.);
8. unusual breathing;
9. symptoms of dehydration;
10. temperature reading over 101° oral, 102° rectal, or 100° axillary; or
11. injury or illness requiring professional medical attention.

#### Finding:

1915.B.&C.: Based on record review/interview at 10:20am the provider failed to report an incident that happened on 9/12/19 to the parent or authorized representative on the same day of occurrence. The provider did not have documentation that they provided immediate notification to the parent of an incident that occurred on 9/12/19 involving an injury to the lip that broke the skin of C1. on 9/12/19, C1 was walking around a table in the classroom and fell. C1 hit lip on the table resulting in broken skin to lip. Based on interview with S1, S10 immediately provided first aid but failed to notify parent, document incident or notify supervisor. S1 stated O1 called S1 to ask what happened to C1 lip and S10 then notified S1 of what happened after S1 inquired. S10 forgot to inform O1 when C1 was picked up. S1 submitted a critical incident report to the department on 9/12/19.
