

Statement of Deficiencies

1909-B: Infants Placed on Backs for Sleeping

Not Met

1909-B: All infants shall be placed on their backs for sleeping.

1. Written authorization from a physician is required for any other sleeping position.
2. Written notice of the specifically authorized sleeping position shall be posted on or near the crib.

Finding:

1909-B Based on record review/observations: The written authorization from a physician for infant to sleep in a different sleeping position was not Posted for 1 of 14 infants on or near crib. Written authorization from a physician was not available for 1 infant, C1, as required for infant to sleep in a different sleeping position. Specialist observed C1 sleeping in a crib with a blanket rolled under the mattress to prop him up. Staff removed the blanket from under the mattress while Specialist was still in the center.

1909-C: Infants - Positioning Devices

Not Met

1909-C: Infants shall not be placed in positioning devices, unless the center has written authorization from a physician to use a positioning device.

Finding:

1909-C Based on record review: Written authorization from a physician was not available for 1 of 14 infants to use a positioning device. C1 had a rolled up towel placed under the mattress to prop C1 up. C1 did not have authorization from a physician to be able to use a positioning device.

1919-D.3.&4.: Food Service and Nutrition - Reasonable Time and Food Served

Not Met

1919-D.3.&4.:

3. Children shall be allowed a reasonable time to eat each meal and snack. Children shall not be forced to finish all their food.
4. Food shall be given to children on individual plates, napkins, paper towels or in cups, as appropriate.

Finding:

1919-D.4 Based on observations: Children's food was not served on individual plates, napkins, paper towels or in cups, as appropriate. Specialist observed children in the infant-1 year old room eating breakfast (pancakes) off of the highchair tray.
