Statement of Deficiencies

1507-A: Daily Attendance Records - Children

1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507-A Based on record review:

The daily attendance log for children did not include the time of departure of each child on 10/3/2017, 10/9/2017, 10/10/2017, 10/11/2017, and 1013/2017. The daily attendance log also did not contain the name of the person to whom the child/children was released on 10/2/2017-10/16/2017.

1715-A.5: State Central Registry

1715-A.5: Personnel files for each staff member shall be maintained at the center and shall include the following: documentation of a current, completed state central registry disclosure form indicating no justified (valid) finding of abuse or neglect by the DCFS, or a current determination from the DCFS indicating that the individual does not pose a risk to children.

Finding:

1715-A.5 Based on record review:

Provider failed to have documentation of a completed state central registry disclosure form (SCR 1)prior to an individual being present in or providing services to the center on site and available for review at the center(1705.A). 2 of 7 staff, S3 and S4 failed to have documentation of the completed form. S3 were on the premises on 7/24/2017 to present and S4 were on the premises on 8/1/2017 to present as verified by staff attendance logs. Both staff were present on the premises during licensing visit. Provider corrected deficiency during licensing visit.

1903-C: Free of Hazards

1903-C: Indoor and outdoor areas shall be free of hazards.

Finding:

1903-C Based on observations:

The indoor and outdoor area were not free of hazards as classrooms contain uncovered wall outlets. Outlets in 2 of 3 classrooms contain electrical outlets that did not have any safety covers .

1915-A: Health Services - Observation

1915-A: Observation. Upon arrival at the center, the physical condition of each child shall be observed for possible signs of illness, infections, bruises or injuries, and when something is observed, it shall be documented and such documentation shall include an explanation from the parent or child.

Finding:

1915-A Based on record review: The provider did not document observations, when something is observed, noted on children upon arrival to the center. Results including an explanation from parent and/or child were not documented 3 consecutive days in September (9/19-21/2017.

1921-E: Tornado Drills

1921-E: Tornado drills shall be conducted at least once per month in the months of March, April, May, and June at various times of the day necessary to include all children and shall be documented.

Finding:

1921-E Based on record review:

The provider did not have documentation of tornado drills that were conducted at least once per month during the months of March, April, and May. The only tornado drill conducted was dated June 7, 2017.
