1719.A.&B.: A. Within seven calendar days of the first day present at the center, and prior to assuming sole responsibility for any children, each staff member shall receive orientation to the policies and practices of the center that at a minimum shall include:

- 1. child abuse identification and reporting;
- 2. emergency preparation;
- 3. licensing regulations; and
- 4. safe sleep practices.
- B. Within 30 calendar days of date of hire, each staff member shall receive orientation to the additional policies and practices of the center that at a minimum shall include:
 - 1. child development;
 - 2. child guidance;
 - 3. learning activities;
 - 4. health and safety;
 - 5. shaken baby prevention; and
 - 6. CPR and first aid, as applicable.

Finding:

1719.A.&B.: A. Based on record review on 10/17/19 at 12:20pm there failed to be evidence that S5 had received the required orientation training. Note: S1 completed training with S5 during this inspection on 10/17/19.

1719.C.: Orientation Training - Transportation staff

Not Met

1719.C.: All staff members responsible for transporting children shall receive additional orientation training in the following areas prior to assuming their transportation duties:

- 1. transportation regulations, including the modeling of how to properly conduct a vehicle passenger check and demonstration by staff to director on how to conduct a vehicle passenger check;
- 2. proper use of child safety restraints required by state Law;
- 3. proper loading, unloading, and tracking of children as required by state law;
- 4. location of first aid supplies; and
- 5. emergency procedures for the vehicle, including actions to be taken in the event of accidents or breakdowns.

Finding:

1719.C. Based on record review: Based on record review on 10/17/19 at 12:20pm there failed to be evidence that S5 who provides transportation had received the required additional transportation related training for orientation. Note: S1 completed training with S5 during this inspection on 10/17/19.

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification Not Met

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A.&B.: Based on record review on 10/17/19 at 12:45pm there failed to be evidence of the required CPR certification for S5 who is the sole staff on van for afternoon school transportation of children.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid Not Met

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.C. Based on record review on 10/17/19 at 12:45pm there failed to be evidence of the required Pediatric First Aid certification for S5 who is the sole staff on van for afternoon school transportation of children.

1911.E.: Daily Reports for Infants

Not Met

1911.E.: Daily Reports for Infants. Written reports that include the liquid intake, food intake, disposition, bowel movements and eating and sleeping patterns shall be given to the parents of infants on a daily basis. Reports shall be kept current throughout the day.

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Statement of Deficiencies

Finding:

1911.E. Based on interview on 10/17/19 at 1:50pm there failed to be maintained daily report for the one infant present.

2103.A.: Parental Authorization

Not Met

2103.A.: Written authorization shall be obtained from a parent to transport a child on a regular basis. Such authorization shall include the name of the child, the type of transportation (to and from school, to and from home) and the names of individuals, schools, or other entities to whom the child may be released.

Finding:

2103.A. Based on record review on 10/17 at 1:25pm there failed to be evidence of written authorization for after school transportation provided for C1, C2, C3, and C4.
