Statement of Deficiencies

1103.A.-D.: Critical Incidents and Required Notifications

1103.A.-D.: An early learning center shall make immediate notification to emergency personnel, law enforcement as applicable, and other appropriate agencies for the following types of critical incidents involving children in care:

- 1. death;
- 2. serious injury or illness that required medical attention;

3. reportable infectious diseases and conditions listed in LAC 51.II.105; and

- 4. any other significant event relating to the health, safety, or well-being of any child, including but not limited to a lost child, an emergency situation,
- fire or other structural damage, or closure of the center.
- B. The parent shall be contacted immediately following any immediate notifications made under Subsection A.
- C. The department and other appropriate agencies shall be notified via email within 24 hours of the incident.
- D. The department shall be notified by written report within 24 hours of the incident or the next business day. This written notification shall be made on
- the department's Critical Incidents Report Form and shall contain all information requested on the form.

Finding:

1509. A.8.a&b.: Based on interviews/record review at 3:30pm, S7 used a prohibited method of discipline on 10/10/19 as C1 was subjected to physical punishment as evidenced by C1 was in time out and was trying to go outside with the rest of the class when S7 placed her hand in his chest and pushed him back causing him to hit his head on the wall. S18 and O1 were standing in the door when this incident took place.

1509.A.8.a.&b.: Behavior Management Policy

1509.A.8.a.&b.: Behavior Management Policy

Each center shall develop and implement a written behavior management policy describing the methods of behavior guidance and management that shall be used at the center.

The behavior management policy shall prohibit children from being subject to any of the following:

i. physical or corporal punishment which includes but is not limited to yelling, slapping, spanking, yanking, shaking, pinching, exposure to extreme temperatures or other measures producing physical pain, putting anything in the mouth of a child, requiring a child to exercise, or placing a child in an uncomfortable position.

ii. verbal abuse, which includes but is not limited to using offensive or profane language, telling a child to "shut up", or making derogatory remarks about children or family members of children in the presence of children;

iii. the threat of a prohibited action even if there is no intent to follow through with the threat;

iv. being disciplined by another child;

v. being bullied by another child;

vi. being deprived of food or beverages;

vii. being restrained by devices such as high chairs or feeding tables for disciplinary purposes; and

viii. having active play time withheld for disciplinary purposes, except timeout may be used during active play time for an infraction incurred during the playtime.

Finding:

1509. A.8.a&b.: Based on interviews/record review at 3:30pm, S7 used a prohibited method of discipline on 10/10/19 as C1 was subjected to physical punishment as evidenced by C1 was in time out and was trying to go outside with the rest of the class when S7 placed her hand in his chest and pushed him back causing him to hit his head on the wall. S18 and O1 were standing in the door when this incident took place.

1713.A.&B.&C.: Supervision

Not Met

1713.A.&B.&C.: A: Children shall be supervised at all times in the center, on the playground, on field trips, on non-vehicular excursions, and during all water activities and water play activities.

B: Children shall not be left alone in any room, (except the restroom as indicated in Subsection G of this Section or when being provided services by therapeutic professionals, as defined in §103), outdoors, or in vehicles, even momentarily, without staff present.

C: A staff person shall be assigned to supervise specific children whose names and whereabouts that staff person shall know and with whom the staff person shall be physically present. Staff shall be able to state how many children are in their care at all times.

Finding:

1713.A.: Based on observation at 2:40pm, children were not under direct supervision at all times as evidenced by while completing walk through in the nursery classroom S8 allowed C1, a 2-year-old, to leave her classroom and come down the hallway to S3's classroom. S8 stated that she thought C1 was going to the restroom.

1715.A.1.&3.: Staff Records and Personnel Files

1715.A.1.&3.: Staff Members. Personnel files for each staff member shall be maintained at the center and shall include the following:

1. an application or staff information form containing the following information:

- a. name;
- b. date of birth;
- c. home address and phone number;
- d. training,
- e. work experience;
- f. educational background;
- g. hire date; and
- h. first day onsite working with children;
- 3. Upon termination or resignation of employment, the last date of employment and reason for leaving;

Finding:

1715.A.1.: Based on record review, at 3:15pm, S17 failed to have an application/staff information form to include name, date of birth, home address and phone number, training, work experience, educational background, hire date, first day onsite working with children for S1. S1 stated that she is the office manager and does not have any interaction with the children. According to the orientation form S1 was hired on 9/30/19.

1723.A.&B.: CPR Certification

1723.A.&B.: A. Infant and child CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR through training approved by the department.

B. Adult CPR. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.A.&B.: Based on record review at 3:15pm, S17 failed to have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in infant, child and adult CPR through training approved by the department. When the LS arrived, 1 of 11 staff had the certification, when S17 arrived at 3:00pm, 2 of 12 staff had documentation of this certification. This was not corrected during the inspection.

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid

1723.C.: Pediatric First Aid. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in pediatric first aid through training approved by the department.

Finding:

1723.C. Based on record review at 3:15pm, S17 did not have documentation that at least fifty percent (50%) of all staff on the premises and accessible to the children or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, have current certification in Pediatric First Aid through training approved by the department. When the LS arrived, 1 of 11 staff had the certification. When S17 arrived at 3:00pm, 2 of 12 staff had documentation of this certification. This was not corrected during the inspection.

1901.M.: Strings and Cords

1901.M.: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

Finding:

1901.M. Based on observations at 2:45pm, strings and cords were accessible to children under age 4 as evidenced by in S10's classroom with 12 one year olds there was a black radio cord hanging off the shelf. S10 turned the shelf to cover the cord making the correction.
