

Statement of Deficiencies

7321-L: Illnesses and Unusual Behavior

Not Met

7321-L: Documentation of illnesses and/or unusual behavior shall be maintained. Documentation shall include child's name, type/description of illness or unusual behavior, date and time of onset and actions taken, time of parental notification and signature of person notifying the parent. The parent or designated person shall be notified immediately in the following situations:

- allergic reaction;
- skin changes e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.;
- unusual breathing;
- dehydration;
- any temperature reading over 101 oral, 102 rectal, or 100 axillary; or
- any illness requiring professional medical attention.

Finding:

7321.L Based on Interviews: The Provider did not maintain documentation of Unusual Behavior that occurred in the center. Per Interviews with S-1, S-15, O-1 and O-2, Specialist learned that the provider had a one year old child (C-1) that was enrolled in the facility on 9-15-14. Specialist learned from interviews that (C-1) was transitioning from a bottle and baby food to a sippy cup and table food. O-1 and O-2 stated that they observed that C-1 eyes appeared sunken and red in appearance and the child was also observed to be a little weak on 9-25-14. The parents indicated that they spoke with the staff at the facility on 9-26-14 and was told that C-1 was not drinking a lot of liquids each day, the parents felt that C-1 was in the beginning stages of being dehydrated because of the lack of fluids that C-1 was receiving while present in the facility each day. Per Interview with the parents (O-1 & O-2), Specialist was informed that the staff at the facility failed to notify them that C-1 was not drinking an adequate amount of liquids each day.
