

Statement of Deficiencies

1915.B.&C.: Health Services - Parental Notification

Not Met

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B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
2. head or neck or eye injury;
3. human bite that breaks the skin;
4. animal bite;
5. impaled object;
6. broken or dislodged teeth;
7. allergic reaction skin changes (e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.);
8. unusual breathing;
9. symptoms of dehydration;
10. temperature reading over 101° oral, 102° rectal, or 100° axillary; or
11. injury or illness requiring professional medical attention.

Finding:

1915.B&C.: Health Services-Parental Notification: Based on Interviews: On 10/29/2019, Specialist gathered from 5 out of 5 interviews with S1, S2, S7, S8, and O2, that the Provider did not have documentation of immediate notification to the parent when the following occurred to a child: C1 falling out of his chair and hitting his face on a chair. Incident occurred roughly around 4:00 pm as stated by S7, but O1 was never notified. O1 picked up C1 and noticed the markings on C1's face and asked the teacher what caused the mark on his face. The provider did not have documentation of incidents of incidents, injuries, and accidents for C1 as of 10/29/2019.
