1507-A: Daily Attendance Records - Children

Not Met

1507-A: A daily attendance record for children shall be maintained that shall:

- 1. include the child's first and last name, arrival and departure times, and first and last name of person or entity to whom the child is released;
- 2. accurately reflect children on the center premises at any given time; and
- 3. be used to sign in and out if a child leaves and returns to the center during the day.

Finding:

1507-A Based on record review: Daily attendance record for children failed to *accurately reflect the number of children on the premises as 32 children were in attendance however only 30 were signed in; **list the time of departure of each child of each day as indicated by records for 10/2017 and 9/2017

1723-A.&B.: CPR Certification Not Met

1723-A.&B.: Infant and child CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR.

Adult CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR.

Finding:

1723-A.&B.: Based on record review: There failed to be Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children that have current certification in infant and child CPR as evidenced by between 6:30am and 8:30am only 1 of 4 staff have current certification and between 8:30am and 3:00pm only 2 of 6 staff are certified.

1723-C.-D.: Pediatric First Aid Not Met

1723-C.-D.: Pediatric First Aid

- C. Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in Pediatric First Aid.
- D. Certification A copy of the certification for each such staff member shall be on-site at all times and available for inspection by the Licensing Division.

Finding:

1723-C.-D. Based on record review: There failed to be Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children that have current Pediatric First certification as evidenced by between 6:30am and 8:30am only 1 of 4 staff have current certification and between 8:30am and 3:00pm only 2 of 6 staff are certified.

1901-J.&K.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

Not Met

1901-J.&K.: Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. 1901-L: Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901-J.&K.: Based on observations: Staff Bathroom was open with a bottle of pine sol within reach of children.
