1515.A.1.: Child Records and Cumulative Files

Not Met

1515.A.1.: A cumulative file shall be maintained on each child that shall include the following records:

- 1. An information form signed and dated by the parent and updated as changes occur, that contains:
- a. name of child, date of birth, sex, date of admission;
- b. name of parents and the home address of both child and parents;
- c. phone numbers where parents may be reached while child is in care;
- d. name and phone number of person to contact in an emergency if parents cannot be located promptly;
- e. name and telephone number of child's physician, if applicable;
- f. name and telephone number of the child's dentist, if applicable;
- g. any special concerns, including but not limited to allergies, chronic illnesses, and any special needs of the child, if applicable;
- h. any special dietary needs, restrictions or food allergies or intolerances, if applicable. See Paragraph 4;

Finding:

1515.A.1: Child Records and Cumulative Files: Based on Record Review at 10:45am: 8 of 10 children's records reviewed (C1-C2, C4-C8 and C10) lacked the required information on the Child's Information Form as the following information was omitted: date of admission.

1901.J.&K.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

Not Met

1901.J.&K.: J. Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children.

K. Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901.J.: Based on Observation at approximately 9:00am: Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, were not kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. Specialist observed in 2 of 3 classrooms cleaning supplies in cabinets that were not locked up. One of the cabinet doors was broken so staff was asked to move items to another cabinet and lock it.

1901.P.: Staff Personal Belongings

Not Met

1901.P.: The personal belongings of center staff members shall be inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901.P. Based on observations at approximately 9:00am: The personal belongings of center staff members S3 and S4 was accessible to children. Specialist observed both S3 and S4's purses accessible to the children in the room. S3's purse was sitting on a chair and S4's purse was sitting on a counter top.

1919.D.2.: Food Service and Nutrition - Choking Hazards

Not Met

1919.D.2.: Children under age 4 shall not have foods that are implicated in choking incidents. Examples of these foods include but are not limited to: whole hot dogs, hot dogs sliced in rounds, raw carrot rounds, whole grapes, hard candy, nuts, seeds, raw peas, hard pretzels, chips, peanuts, popcorn, marshmallows, spoonsful of peanut butter, and chunks of meat larger than what can be swallowed whole.

Finding:

1919.D.2. Based on observations at approximately 11:00am: The Provider allowed children under age 4 to have sausage cut into rounds that were larger than what can be swallowed whole, which are implicated in choking incidents. Specialist asked staff to cut the sausage into smaller bites and they did.
