

Statement of Deficiencies

1103-A-D: Critical Incidents and Required Notification

Not Met

1103-A-D: An early learning center shall make immediate notification to emergency personnel, law enforcement as applicable, and other appropriate agencies for the following types of critical incidents involving children in care:

1. death;
 2. serious injury or illness that required medical attention;
 3. reportable infectious diseases and conditions listed in LAC 51.II.105; and
 4. any other significant event relating to the health, safety, or well-being of any child, including but not limited to a lost child, an emergency situation, fire or other structural damage, or closure of the center.
- B. The parent shall be contacted immediately following any immediate notifications made under Subsection A.
- C. The Licensing Division and other appropriate agencies shall be notified via email within 24 hours of the incident.
- D. The Licensing Division shall be notified by written report within 24 hours of the incident or the next business day. This written notification shall be made on the Licensing Division's Critical Incidents Report Form and shall contain all information requested on the form.

Finding:

1103-C-D: Based on record review/interview: S1, Director, failed to notify by written report to Licensing within 24 hours of becoming aware of an incident that allegedly occurred on Monday, 9/24/2018. Specialist interviewed S1 and she stated that she became aware on Wednesday, 9/26/2018 of the allegation that S4 used inappropriate behavioral management by calling C1 a "crybaby". O1 was informed of alleged incident the same day, 9/26/2018, as S1. As of 11/9/2018, S1, Director, has not reported incident to Licensing.

1725-A.-D.: Medication Management Training

Not Met

- 1725-A.-D.: A. All staff members who administer medication shall have medication administration training.
- B. Whether administering medication or not, each early learning center shall have at least two staff members trained in medication administration.
- C. Such training shall be completed every two years with an approved Child Care Health Consultant.
- D. A licensed practical nurse (LPN) or registered nurse (RN) with a valid nursing license shall be considered to have medication administration training.

Finding:

1725-A: Based on record review/interview: Specialist reviewed staff files on Friday, 11/09/2018 and determined the Center does not have at least two staff members trained in medication management. Specialist interviewed S1 and confirmed that all employees, S1-S5, do not have a current Medication Management Training.
