Statement of Deficiencies

1723-A.&B.: CPR Certification Not Met

1723-A.&B.: A - Infant and child CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in infant and child CPR.

B - Adult CPR - Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in adult CPR.

Finding:

1723-A.&B.: Based on record review: There failed to be Fifty percent of 10 staff members present on the premises of the center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, that have current certification in infant and child CPR when 3 of the 5 certified staff leave the premises to provided after school pick up.

1723-C.-D.: Pediatric First Aid Not Met

1723-C.-D.:

- C. Pediatric First Aid Fifty percent of staff members on the premises of a center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, whichever is less, shall have current certification in Pediatric First Aid.
- D. Certification A copy of the certification for each such staff member shall be on-site at all times and available for inspection by the Licensing Division.

Finding:

1723-C.-D. Based on record review: Based on record review: There failed to be Fifty percent of 10 staff members present on the premises of the center and accessible to children, or at least four staff on the premises and accessible to children, that have current certification in Pediatric First Aid when 3 of the 5 certified staff leave the premises to provided after school pick up.

1901-J.&K.: Items That Can be Harmful to Children

Not Met

1901-J.&K.: Items that can be harmful to children, such as medications, poisons, cleaning supplies and chemicals, and equipment, tools, knives and other potentially dangerous utensils, shall kept in a locked cabinet or other secure place that ensures they are inaccessible to children. Plastic bags, when not in use, regardless of purpose or use, shall be made inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901-J.&K. Based on observations: Items that can be harmful to children failed to be inaccessible to children as evidenced by plastic bags stuffed with linen was piled in hallway near water fountain.

1901-M: Strings and Cords

Not Met

1901-M: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

Finding:

1901-M Based on observations: String and cords failed to be inaccessible to children as evidenced by cords were observed hanging within reach of children in the one year, three year, and three-four classes.
